
The popular and successful release of acoustic album 'El Momento D'escuidado', followed by a tour in which further material such as 'Grind', 'Two Places At Once' and 'Pure Chance' flourished has prompted this follow up.

Although in a similar style and with similar artwork / presentation, the use of strings, a surprising guest vocal, a cover to open with and three brand new songs ensure it's got an identity of its own. Elsewhere the crystal clear clarity particularly on the vocals and the detailed intricate playing of the first album remain without restricting the broad dynamic range which encompasses the gentle moments of 'Pure Chance' and heavy play out of 'Grind' sitting side by side with comfort.

Opening with a cover of The Triffids' 'Wide Open Road', it's a warm uplifting number, which has already featured, in recent live sets. 'It's No Reason' is similar to the live version featured on the 'Easy' single with Cello and Violin replacing the haunting backing vocals of the original. 'Electric Lash' is as 'fun' as ever with its driving momentum whilst Maven fave 'After Everything' is a glorious highlight, further colourised by strings. New track 'Song In The Afternoon' is a breezy feel good number with a memorable vocal melody whilst Peter Koppes' 'Appalatia' becomes piano based to fine effect. 'Pure Chance' would have been perhaps too straight a conversion were it not for a surprising twist as Steve duets with vocalist Inga Liljestrom. 'Grind' as ever dynamically excites with soloing and a grandstand finish.

'NSEW' is a remarkable conversion to a whole different mood and tempo.

Closing instrumental 'Comeuppance', also featured live in recent shows is a brief triumphant up-tempo number closing and adding yet further to an album of surprises and variation.
